CAPS Psychiatry Utilization and Need



As mental health issues continue to affect UA students (in line with national trends), there remains a significant need for CAPS Psychiatry services. This report will review some key insights and utilization data to demonstrate this need and the value of on-campus psychiatry for UA students.

~25% all CAPS visits are Psychiatry visits

~28%

of all students using CAPS have used Psychiatry Services

Key Insights:

- On average, around a quarter of all CAPS visits per year are Psychiatry visits, and almost a third of all CAPS clients use Psychiatry services.
- Obwnward trends in psychiatry utilization reflect circumstances around COVID-19 challenges as well as loss of Psychiatry staff, <u>not</u> decreased demand. In a conservative estimate, the data suggests that as many as 12% of students (~4,700 main campus enrolled) who may need services but have not used them could benefit from CAPS Psychiatry.

While Campus Health provides medication management for some students to manage mental health, this support only offsets a small amount of the overall demand, and has decreased in recent years as a result of challenges presented by COVID-19


One or more mental health symptoms Overwhelming anxiety Hopelessness 50%


Select mental health symptoms reported by UA

73% of students reporting one or more mental health symptoms in the past year have not used any mental health services during that same timeframe





*Estimated by taking the proportion of students with most severe mental health symptoms (68% - so depressed it was difficult to function, overwhelming anxiety, hopelessness, tremendous stress, suicidal ideation, and symptoms making it very difficult to go about daily activities), multiplying that proportion by a conservative 20% (based on Psychiatry visits composing 25% of all CAPS visits), and identifying that proportion of the overall sample. Even if only a small fraction of those students wanted and could use CAPS Psychiatry services, the demand would be higher than the current resources can support.
